NEWS FROM TINTAGEL PARISH COUNCIL

TINTAGEL VISITOR CENTRE

After months of lengthy consultation with Cornwall Council, Parish Council members agreed at the January meeting to proceed with negotiations to purchase Tintagel Visitor Centre from Cornwall Council. Although the Centre is currently closed it is strongly felt that the Centre is an important asset to the Parish which relies heavily on tourism for its livelihood. The Parish Council will bring further news once negotiations are complete.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCE REVIEW

An announcement came from Cornwall Council in late November that the review of provision of public conveniences throughout the County had been put on hold for 12 months. The review had announced that Cornwall Council would withdraw funding for the conveniences at Bossiney and the Visitor Centre, with a grant being offered to the Parish Council to continue to operate the conveniences at Trevena Square and Trebarwith Strand.

It is understood that the cuts previously announced will stand but it gives Parish and Town Councils a chance to consider their options on proposals put to them by Cornwall Council only in October 2011.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

The event held on the 10th December was again a huge success. The Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to thank the hardworking ladies and gentlemen of the Lighting Committee who work hard to stage this special winter event for Tintagel.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING – PROPOSAL BY CORNWALL COUNCIL FOR SITE TO REAR OF FOSTERS LANE

Westcountry Housing and Cornwall Council held an open evening at the Social Hall on 15th December with some brief details of a proposal they have for a site off Fosters Lane/ School Hill. The event was well attended with a range of comments and feelings being voiced. To date, no further information has been received on the proposal but the Parish Council hope to meet with representatives of the Housing Association and Cornwall Council in the near future.

TREVENA SQUARE

Work is underway to clear the wall and planted area near the bike rack in preparation for the siting of a Cornish Cross. It is intended to re-use some of the stone, capping and poem slates from the original wall to complete work to this area.

CO-OPTION OF PARISH COUNCILLOR

Mr. Max Roberts was co-opted to the Parish Council at the January meeting. The Parish Council welcomes Max and feels sure that he will be a welcome addition to the team.

Serious crime is down and only a few incidents of petty crime have been reported. We ask the public to report any problems to the new number 101 or for serious incidents 999.


We are in the process of setting up a monthly meeting at Sir James Smith School when we have moved, then a follow up meeting at Camelford Council Offices.

A happy New Year to you all from everyone at Tintagel SAC, it's hard to believe we are into another year and season already, 2011 seems to have passed by in the blink of an eye.

Sea temperatures remain relatively high at 10° C at the time of writing, which is 2° C higher than the same time last year. The usual winter species are present and whiting dab, codling, coalfish and flounder are all being recorded. Shore fishing during November and December was quite difficult in conditions that were dominated by strong squally winds. January has remained mild and there are reports of mackerel still being caught from the shore.

The Fish of the month winner in November was David Gibson with an excellent flounder of 2lb 4ozs. Derek Nute won the fish of the month in December with another flounder of 1lb 10ozs. The end of year results are now complete and congratulations go to lan Young who won the boat angler of the year and Garry Boyde who won the shore angler of the year and the overall angler of the year. A full roll of honour will be posted in the next journal newsletter. A collaboration flounder match was fished at the River Camel on Sunday 22nd January and attracted a number of entrants, fishing was difficult but Chris Boden of Cadsac came first with a fish of 1lb $11 \frac{1}{2}$ ozs and David Gibson came second with a fish of 1lb 9ozs.

Tintagel SAC held their Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 10th January 2012 at the Wootons Hotel, Tintagel. It was very well attended and everyone is looking forward to the new season. New members are most welcome.

Manny said, "It was a fantastic event. Everyone got involved making it a fun event for the children and parents".



CORNWALL COUNCIL NEWS FROM COUNCILLOR GLENTON BROWN

The Cornwall Planning for the future.

The Core Strategy details are now emerging and we are in a **CORNWALL** consultation period until late March. Please don't hesitate to make **COUNCIL** contact me if you want information into future plans for instance, education, health, employment, leisure, highways and the environment.

There has already been a long period of debate as to the number of houses to be built between 2010 and 2030, with suggestions from 35000 to 50000 more homes in Cornwall. The suggested figure I understand from the consultation process is 48000 new homes inclusive of affordable and sociable housing development. This would be for instance in our Camelford network area in the region of 800 new houses.

I just wonder about the extra volume of traffic of say 1.5 cars per family, what this would mean on our roads and the increase in population putting heavy demands on all Cornwall's infrastructure and suggestions are being made overcome them.

The economic reality looks improbable, and one wonders if this is the Cornwall we should be planning for.

TINTAGEL RESPONDERS

The Tintagel Responder Group went active on 1st April 2004 & since then its members have attended several hundred call outs to patients in the parish, providing them with emergency care before the arrival of ambulance staff.

The team is supplied with oxygen, a defibrillator, various bag-masks, a comprehensive first aid kit, mobile phone & pager. Over the years additional kit has been purchased from donations including a state of the art pulse oxometer, thermometer & satellite navigation system.

The members are under the direct control of the West Country Ambulance Trust & cannot attend any patient without the authorisation of the Ambulance service. Each member agrees to a duty period & during that time has responsibility for the kit having booked on with Ambulance control at Exeter.

It's then a question of waiting for a call, which can happen at any time day or night, the ones at 3 a.m. are not the most popular! Once the pager is activated the responder must contact the response desk at Exeter & only then will they be asked to attend the incident. Ambulance control will prioritise the 999 calls to them & if they think the situation is very urgent & life threatening they will contact the responder by phone to speed up the response time.

The local Responder is backed up by a Paramedic in a rapid response vehicle who will then decide whether an ambulance is needed.

People often wonder why it sometimes takes a while for an ambulance to arrive, this is purely down to resources. We are fortunate to have one based at Camelford though it is not on standby 24/7. If this is on a call then back-up is drawn from either Wadebridge, Bodmin or Bude. Occasionally, if these are dealing with an emergency, a crew may come from even further afield or the air ambulance may be deployed, though this is restricted to daylight hours.

Tintagel Responders are in need of new recruits. From the original group of 12 we are now down to 4 members who volunteer their time free of charge. These 4 live busy lives & they are struggling to provide 24 hour care for the community. If you feel you can spare the time to help such a worthwhile cause then contact Marianne Tapper on 770920. Full training is given, you just need to be reasonably fit with your own car.

Remember if you live in a remote rural area you must expect a remote service however you could help make a difference.

THE FUTURE OF CAMELFORD LEISURE CENTRE

The future of the Leisure Centre is still uncertain, a situation now surrounded by confusion. 'The Friends' understanding is as follows:

FACT

- 1. As from 1st December the Centre, along with all others in Cornwall, was transferred to Carrick Leisure Trust, and will remain in the Trust at least until 31 March 2012.
- 2. The Steering Group have to produce a Business Plan by 31 December. This Plan should indicate whether the Centre is financially viable into the future.

POSSIBLE

- 1. The Business Plan indicates that the Centre should be funded beyond 31 March 2012 for a few months to test in detail the viability of the Plan. The Centre would remain in Carrick Leisure Trust, with funding from Cornwall Council.
- 2. Cornwall Council may close the Centre on 31 March 2012.

The more the Centre is used the greater the possibility it has a future
