ANNUAL PUBLIC PARISH MEETING

The Annual Public Parish Meeting was held on the 9th May. Due to recent complaints made to the Parish Council in the public session of their meetings, PC Laurie O'Toole and PCSO Terry Groves were invited to attend. Unfortunately, only 4 members of the public attended; however, the meeting did prove to be an informative one.

TINTAGELWEB WEBSITE

Tintagel Parish Council is able to publish its Draft Minutes on a regular basis on www.tintagelweb.co.uk and is grateful to Mr. David Flower for allowing such publication. Draft Minutes are normally available to view on the website from the Wednesday following the previous weeks' meeting. In future, Agendas for forthcoming Parish Council meetings will also be available on the site. The website is viewed by people all over the world and includes a wealth of information including local news and events, local sport, places to stay, photographs (old and new), weather and links to other useful websites.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES

At the time of writing we have no further information on Cornwall Council's Public Convenience Review. At the end of 2011 the Parish Council received correspondence from Cornwall Council advising that funding would be withdrawn for two locations in the parish with a grant being offered to the Parish Council to run the other two. Due to many objections from Parish and Town Councils and residents all over the County, Cornwall Council put the review on hold for approx. 12 months. Following a letter of concern sent by the Parish Council to Cornwall Council, we have been invited to meet with a Cabinet Member from Cornwall Council; this meeting will take place in June when it is hoped that some of the Parish Council's concerns will be discussed. It is clear that with the devolution of services by Cornwall Council, Parish and Town Councils are expected to take on more and more services – some of them crucial to the wellbeing of the parish and its dependence on tourism.

LATEST NEWS – Many of you will be aware that Mr. Les Freke was nominated to run in the Olympic Torch Relay for his services to Surf Life Saving and as a Community First Responder. He did this in Devon on the 21st May. Les has made a wonderful offer for the Jubilee celebrations that the torch be symbolically used to light the Jubilee Beacon after being run in a relay through the village from 9.45 p.m. by members of the Surf Life Saving Club.

Please note – limited parking will be available in Mr. Dangar's field (on Church Hill just before the church) for the beacon event. NO PARKING will be permitted beyond the church coming from the village side, approaching from Tregatta Corner/Trevillick or along the track. These access roads must be kept clear for emergency access. Please walk to the event if possible.

Tintangels Pre-School

Tintangels Pre-School which although loosely affiliated to Tintagel Primary School is a registered charity within its own right, committee run, and is totally outside all school funding.

The committee have been rigorously fundraising over the past 12 months with the specific aim of enhancing the outside learning environment for our children. We are now in the position to be able to start planning and purchasing the beginnings of our outside area. This will take several years more fundraising before the environment is at its optimum.

I should like to ask you if anyone would like to consider supporting this venture in some small way. With each item of equipment costing between £500 and £1000 and with the wetpour rubber safety surface costing £140 per square metre any contribution will be extremely gratefully received! We will continue to organise press coverage as our venture proceeds.

TINTAGEL MEMORIAL PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION

As the summer approaches and the Football season gives way to the Cricket season, the playing fields area is looking immaculate thanks to the hard work that

the volunteer groundsmen have put in over the past few months.

However, we have the perpetual recurring problem of litter being left around the skate park area which is creating both an eyesore and a health and safety problem to the extent that one of the volunteer litter pickers received a cut to his hand recently which was serious enough to necessitate a visit to the GP surgery. The Council's rubbish collection



service will not collect from inside the Tintagel Memorial Playing Fields Area, therefore, the Trustees have decided to acquire a trailer for removing the rubbish. The money for this has been donated by Hartley Home Care as part of their sponsorship this year and one of the Trustees, Dr Guy Keenan, has kindly volunteered to transport the collected litter on a regular basis. I would like to take this opportunity to offer thanks to him in particular and also the others who strive tirelessly to maintain the area for the public good.

There is also the problem of trying to stop the acts of vandalism being perpetrated around the area. We, the Trustees, have decided to apply to have a Neighbourhood Watch Area created in the playing fields area. We are asking for volunteers from those who live in the area adjacent to the playing fields to assist in this project by either being the local Watch Area Co-ordinator or being local Watch Volunteers. Hopefully, these measures should ensure that the Playing Fields remain the superb public facility that, as the second largest such facility in North Cornwall is the envy of many towns and villages in the wider community.

Tintagel Sea Angling Club Newsletter – June 2012

March and April were difficult months with the fishing being very sporadic. However, with sea temperatures haven risen to 11^{0} C the summer species have started their return. The mackerel shoals have been large and abundant just offshore. Bream have also appeared along with garfish.

The Sea Fisheries Committees (SFC's) in England have been replaced by the Inshore Fisheries Conservation Authority (IFCA's) who's role is to manage a sustainable marine environment and inshore fishery. A link to the Cornwall Branch can be found here:

The new organisation is being monitored with interest by recreation angling organisations such as the Bass Anglers Sportfishing Society (BASS) and the Cornish Federation of Sea Anglers (CFSA). The specific interest to the recreational organisations is the Minimum landing Sizes (MLS's) for commercial vessels these have been adopted from the old SFC but it is hoped that they will be increased for certain species such as bass, mullet and dab. Currently the MLS for bass is 37.5cm and female bass do not mature until they reach at least 42cms. The grey mullet MLS is 20cm but the female does not reach maturity until 47cms. Common sense would indicate that the IFCA would look at reviewing the old MLS's and furthermore involve recreation representatives in there discussions.

The efforts of Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstal with his "Fish Fight" go on and over 794,000 people have now signed up. The campaign has been extended to Europe and just launched in Germany and Poland http://www.fishfight.net/

Forthcoming club events during June and July include a boat trip to Dartmouth to fish the Skerries bank for plaice. A collaboration match with CADSAC on the weekend of July 20^{th} to 22^{nd} with the weigh in at the Wootons from $10 - 10.30 \, \text{pm}$. The target species for fish of the month in June is Bass and in July, it is mullet.

The big tides in June are on the 5th & 6th with the full moon on the 4th and the new moon on the 19th where sunrise will be at 5.08 & sunset at 21.34

In July the big tides are on the 4^{th} & 5^{th} and the full moon is on the 3^{rd} the new moon is on the 19^{th} when sunrise will be at 5.34 & sunset at 21.19

The next general meeting will be held on Tuesday 5th June at the Wootons Hotel at 7.30pm.

Tintagel Surf Life Saving Club: Olympic Torch Run

I was delighted to be nominated as a torch bearer for this year's Olympic games & after several months was informed that my nomination had been successful. An incredible honour to be one of only 8000 picked from the many thousands of applicants especially as my sponsors, Samsung, alone had over 140,000 applications. My allocated place was in Ilfracombe on Monday 21st May & having seen the reaction of the Cornish crowds to the start of the run I realised what an amazing experience this was to be.

My wife Angela & I had travelled up the night before & found where I was running so we could let the Cornish supporters know where to meet up, so all was ready for the big day.

The weather on Monday was glorious, clear blue skies and not too hot! Having dropped Angela in the town centre, which was decorated with bunting & flags, I drove to the assembly point for the torch bearers. Samsung had provided a special minibus for the runners & having had my ID checked there was plenty of time to meet & get to know the other torch bearers one of whom was Jonathan Edwards the Olympic triple jumper, an Ilfracombe lad.


With an hour to go there was a change of plan, could we all do double the distance as some runners hadn't shown up! This meant I was now running the 2 legs before my original one. Thank goodness for mobile phones. I managed to let Angela know & Ellie our Samsung hostess promised to find any supporters from Tintagel & move them to the right place.

It was time to go. The minibus took us out to the edge of Ilfracombe where we waited with excitement building for the torch convoy to arrive from Barnstaple. The first of many police motorcycles came past all decorated with flags & then the main sponsors coaches could be seen in the distance. We pulled out in front & were dropped off with our torches at our start positions, a final check by a police cyclist that the gas in the torch was working then it was a matter of waiting for the moment. Suddenly Angela appeared, having got a lift from friends, so all was well, as I had been worried that she would miss the start.

A few minutes wait, then the police outriders appeared followed by the sponsors' cars, then the open backed media coach & there was my fellow torch bearer flanked by the police runners. A touch of our torches to exchange the flame & then it was time to run. It was an amazing experience, cheered on by complete strangers, then round a bend in the road it was great to see a group of friends holding the Tintagel Surf Life Saving Club flag & shouting their support.

All too soon, even though it was double the distance, it was time to hand on the flame to the next runner, a few quick photos with the gang then on to another minibus to be part of the procession through the town. We had a great view of our fellow torch bearers ahead of us & at each change over huge cheers of support for each other. Even though we had completed our runs the crowds still cheered us as we passed, all too soon we were back at our original meeting place where the whole convoy pulled in for lunch before they moved on up the coast.

Finally Samsung presented us with the actual torch that we had run with as a lasting memento of this incredible day.



Even then it was not completely over for as I was showing Angela & a few of the Tintagel supporters my torch, I had complete strangers asking if they could have a photo taken with 'the torch' including mums with babies, toddlers & a gentleman whose 70th birthday was that day & whose family had made him a cardboard torch! It was a fun ending to a memorable occasion.

My last words must be a huge thank you to Eve Stratton who nominated me & to Hilary Desousa who provided much of the information needed. I was proud to have represented my club & the community of Tintagel so thank you all for your good wishes.

CORNWALL COUNCIL: DOG FOULING AND STRAY DOGS: DOG OWNERS MUST TAKE RESPONSIBILITY



Due to the recent increase of Dog fouling complaints from Tintagel, the area is now being more heavily patrolled by the Dog Welfare &

Enforcement Team and Enviro-Crime Officers, I would like to remind Dog owners that should we catch them not cleaning up after their Dogs we will issue Fixed penalty notices to offenders currently set at £80.00 or prosecute at Magistrates Court where the penalty is up to £1000.00 maximum in view of this I would urge Dog owners to be responsible and clean up after your Dogs. Persons who clean up and throw the bags into hedges are liable for littering fixed penalties as they are committing an additional offence.

Cornwall Council has become the first council in the country to be authorised to train Town and Parish Council staff to issue fixed penalties for dog fouling and littering, and as such the number of people able to issue a fixed penalty notice is much higher. We are also currently training staff from other departments to issue notices – many of which do not wear uniform or have a marked vehicle – as such there are significantly more people who are able to catch offenders and therefore the chance of being caught much greater. Should any member of the public see someone failing to clean up after their dog has fouled a public area, and know who the owner of the dog is or take vehicle details - please let us know on 0300 1234 212.

Claire Woodbine from the Pinsla Gardens and Nursery at Cardinham was our speaker for April; her subject Ferns and Shady Plants.

There is a wide range of plants which either tolerate or flourish in shaded areas, which Claire divided into four

groups – Chusan palms, bamboo, Japanese anemones for exotic effect, dryoptera, maidenhair and Japanese painted ferns for a primitive effect. Bluebells, snowdrops, primroses and wood anemones for a woodland scene, with rhododendrons, azaleas, viburnums and ligularias for the traditional shaded areas.

Clare is a passionate plants lady and her beautifully illustrated address gave us many new ideas for our own gardens.

Our final talk in May, before our summer break, was from our own Michael Davey, a retired horticulturist, on Gardening with Wild Life,

It consisted of a conducted tour, via excellent slides compiled by his wife, Diana, of a garden he once owned and had created over many years.

This was a ¾ acre plot, near the cliffs at Tintagel, with two challenges – salt laden winds and badgers. A fence, trees and an inner hedge provided an eight foot wide wind filter, and the garden was divided into a series of rooms by trees and shrubs, all connected by a maze of path ways, beckoning the visitor around the next corner – perhaps a cascade of roses or a gravel garden; always something to delight the eye.

About those pathways – badger runs, well they were there first; they solved the dilemma of a wasps' nest. One morning it had gone – they had smelt the honey. The vegetable garden was another matter – irrestible to badgers, it had to be fenced off.

A wild life pond attracted its own residents – frogs, newts, and a mired of insects. The badgers drank there too. The frogs also commandeered a water trough - and it remained their home for many amphibian generations.

There was so much more included in this magical tour and now Michael is creating a new garden, another haven to share with wild life and his human friends.

The first of our summer visits was to the Trewithen Gardens – a family run estate near Truro, mainly of woodland walks, consisting of many varieties of unusual tree, together with rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias all in glorious flower. They also have a red squirrel breeding project, together with a plant nursery, a shop and excellent café. The sunshine ensured a truly memorable visit.
