Most parishioners will already be aware that with the retirement of the postmaster, Mick Goward, the Post Office in Bossiney Road is to close on the 27th February. The Post Office is in talks with at least two other businesses in the Parish to provide Post Office services in the future. It is hoped that there will be no period of closure as Mr. Goward's daughter has offered to run a reduced service for an additional month. Latest news from the Post Office has indicated that it is hoped services will be open in the new location from 6th April.

TREVENA SQUARE

The Parish Council have recently acquired the strip of land adjacent to the Square with a view to improving safety and vehicle access to the Square. It was suggested that a Public Meeting be held to discuss all future plans for the Square and this will form part of the Annual Public Parish Meeting to be held in early May.

The Parish Council have agreed with Cornwall Council for the car park at Trevena Square to form part of their Parking Places Order effective from 1st April. This will mean that the area can be patrolled by civil parking enforcement officers and Fixed Penalty notices issued to vehicle owners who do not adhere to the car park restrictions. PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU HAVE A VALID PERMIT FOR YOUR CAR AND THAT YOUR CAR REGISTRATION NUMBER IS CLEARLY VISIBLE. It is appreciated that some permits have faded. You may re-write your registration number on the permit as long as it is the same registration number for which the permit was obtained as a list will be provided to Cornwall Council of all valid permits.

DOG FOULING

ARE YOU CONCERNED ABOUT THE AMOUNT OF DOG MESS LEFT ON OUR ROADS, PAVEMENTS AND FOOTPATHS BY IRRESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS?

An issue which received a lot of comments on the Tintagel Parish Plan was Dog Fouling. Unfortunately, although there are many responsible dog owners in the Parish, there are also many *irresponsible* dog owners. Did you know that both Cornwall Council Street Wardens and the local Police Community Support Officers can issue Fixed Penalty Notices to people who do not clean up after their dogs.

Would you be prepared to stand as a witness in court?

If so, if you see someone who does not clean up after their dog and you know their name and address, you should contact Debbie Attwell, Cornwall Council Street Ranger on 07768 775928. The more information you can give the better and if you can take photographs this would assist in the prosecution. She can issue a Fixed Penalty Notice to the person concerned. If the Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid, the case will go to court as long as you are prepared to act as a witness. A MESSAGE FROM TERRY GROVES ABOUT DOG FOULING

I would just like to say hello and to make people more aware of the The Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2005

We have now been given the authority to issue tickets for dog fouling. The areas this covers is as follows

- all carriageways with a speed limit of 40mph or less
- all footpaths, verges and land adjacent to carriageways with a speed limit of 40 mph or less.
- all parks and playing fields, children's playgrounds and play areas, public and ornamental gardens, housing and public amenity areas
- all beaches in public and private ownership which includes the foreshore between low and high water and land described as beach above the high water mark.
- all car parks, parking areas or land used for parking of vehicles.
- all public footpaths and land adjacent to public footpaths to which the public have access
- all pedestrianised areas including shopping precincts.

As caring dog owners you should be aware that leaving your dog mess either where it lays or even leaving the bag you pick it up in on the ground is unsightly and potentially dangerous to children.

There are bins provided.

TINTAGEL CRICKET CLUB – CRICKET FORCE

With an eye on the future, Tintagel Cricket Club are to participate in the ECB Natwest Cricket Force In 2010.
