Public Convenience Review

Recent information from Cornwall Council has indicated that their Public Convenience Review has been put on hold for 12 months. Cornwall Council had confirmed that they would no longer fund the provision of public conveniences at the Visitor Centre and Bossiney and that they would offer a grant to the Parish Council to continue the cleaning and maintenance of the facilities at Trevena Square and Trebarwith Strand should they wish to consider this option. It appears that the feedback Cornwall Council has received from Parish and Town Councils, ratepayers and local members has given this matter a reprieve, albeit a temporary one. The Parish Council will be meeting with representatives from Cornwall Council in the New Year to discuss future proposals for the service.

Tintagel Visitor Centre

The Parish Council are still considering its future interest in the Visitor Centre. Many questions have been asked of Cornwall Council to ensure that the service the Parish Council may be able to provide, should it proceed with lease or purchase of the Centre, is the right one for all concerned. A recent newsletter from Cornwall Council on the subject of "Localism and Devolution" has prompted the Parish Council to request a further face to face meeting with Cabinet Members to discuss the matter.

Could you be a Parish Councillor?

Tintagel Parish Council currently has two vacancies for co-option to the Parish Council. As a councillor you can become a voice for your community and you need to have the concerns and best interests of the parish as a whole at heart. Councillors are community leaders and should represent the aspirations of the public that they serve.

Parish Councils are the most local part of our democratic system and are closest to the public. Why don't you stand for your local parish council and see what difference you can make to your local community? The people who make up parish councils give their time and expertise for nothing – their only reward is to bring improvements to their communities, often in the face of difficult circumstances.

Many parish councils in rural areas struggle to keep their numbers up, yet being a member can be immensely rewarding, as any past or present parish councillors will tell you. There is no lack of talented people in all communities and it would be a tremendous boost to our parish council to be joined by a few of their number.

The skills and qualities required of a Parish Councillor are someone who is approachable; who listens; who understands the situation for the benefit of the Parish; who can discern and make objective decisions; who can work with and encourage others in the village; and who can work together as a Council with a collective agreement even at the expense of personal interests.

The Parish Council meets once a month, in the evening, on the first Wednesday of the month (no meeting in August). There are additional meetings throughout the year depending on urgent business, planning application deadlines, special events in the village and an Annual General Meeting.

Am I qualified?

Most people are. However there are a few basic rules. You have to be: a British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union, and 18 years or older on the day you become nominated for election, and live or work in or near the parish.

Interested ? - Applications should be made <u>in writing</u> to the Clerk at the address on the back of this newsletter no later than noon on Friday 23rd December 2011. Applicants will be invited to meet with the Parish Council on Wednesday 4th January 2012. If you require any further information regarding qualification etc. please contact the Clerk.

Affordable Housing Development in Tintagel

COME ALONG AND HAVE YOUR SAY!

The affordability of homes is an issue across much of Cornwall, in particular in picturesque areas such as Tintagel Parish where there is a relatively high level of second home ownership, approximately 15% of all homes in the Parish.

According to Cornwall Council's Homechoice Register, there are currently 61 people with a local connection to Tintagel Parish who are looking for affordable housing to rent, to buy, or part buy.

To be eligible for affordable housing your income must be such that you cannot afford to rent or buy a property at open market prices and to apply for affordable housing, you should have a local connection to the area. This often means that you have lived or worked in the Parish for the last 3 years or that you have family ties here.

Providing affordable housing on suitable sites helps to create balanced communities. It breaths fresh life into rural villages and can help ensure local people can stay in their community whatever their age or circumstances. New affordable housing can help support local services like Post Offices, shops, pubs and schools year round.

Cornwall Council has been approached by a housing association who wants to provide 24 affordable homes for local people on land between Fosters Lane and Tintagel Primary School.

Cornwall Council would like to know your views on developing this site so please come along to the public exhibition and have your input. You may be a neighbour, local business, an interested member of the community or someone who is interested in affordable housing for yourself.

There will be a representative of the housing association to answer your questions about the proposed development and also representative from Cornwall Council to answer your questions about affordable housing.

CORNWALL COUNCIL NEWS FROM COUNCILLOR GLENTON BROWN

I spent the morning of Thursday 17th November at County Hall debating the Cornish Stadium, and to my mind it is not a stadium for Cornwall but a stadium for mid and west Cornwall to accommodate Truro City Football Club and the Pirates Rugby

Team. The application consisted of a proposed 10,000 seater stadium and a 120 bed new hotel with very limited parking facilities . Into the future there are plans for a massive housing estate in this area and there will just have to be new roads constructed as the stadium parking would be very restricted with the roads not suitable, leading to tremendous pressure on the A390 as it is. The park and ride would be the main source of parking for this new stadium. It was approved 14 votes to 4 and I must admit I voted against it as this Cornish stadium was just not in the right position and should surely have been in an area from Fraddon across to Roche in mid Cornwall to accommodate the north of the county who I suspect will still look to Plymouth or over the Devon border for any of their big sporting and entertainment events. It just did not cater for the people from Bude to Launceston and across to Callington and Saltash. Some people will argue that many of these people will go in another direction because of distance. This new stadium will have permission for only a few other non sporting events per annum and to me there has been no planning even considered for athletics, swimming and other sports.



Tintagel Sea Angling Club Newsletter – November 2011

Sea temperatures have started to fall but are still relatively high at 14[°]C at the time of writing (mid November), which means we can still expect some sport with the lures.



The usual autumn / winter species are present and whiting codling, coalfish and flounder are all being recorded. Shore fishing during September and October was good as normal with some better fish being caught.

Fish of the month winner in September was Ian Young with a Pollack of 8lb 10 3/8 Ozs. Congratulations go to vice president Gary Boyde who won the CADSAC open with an exceptional shore caught smoothound of 8lb 4 ½ Ozs, (207%). Nigel Rundle also claimed two prizes for best pollack and best unclassified with a pollack of 3lb 5 ½ Ozs (84%) and a shore rockling of 95.5%. The St Columb bass festival was extremely well attended with over 200 entrants and club members Derek Nute and Ian Young were among the prizewinners claiming 5th and 7th place respectively. A collaboration flounder competition fished on Sunday November 13th at the Camel estuary was well attended and narrowly won by Garry Boyde with a fish of 2lb 2ozs, (106%) 2nd place went to Derek Nute with a fish of 2lb 1 ½ Ozs (105%) and third place went to Rob Harper of CADSAC. The various annual club awards are being eagerly contested with only a few weeks to go until the end of the year.


Thank you from the Boscastle & District Branch of the RNLI fund raising committee.

FLYPOSTING AND GRAFFITI

Flyposting and graffiti are illegal, spoil both public and private property and can be very costly to remove.

Graffiti and flyposting are both criminal offences carrying large fines given out by a magistrate, or up to £80 fixed penalty notice issued by the local authority or police. If you see any one doing

graffiti or flyposting, you should report it to Cornwall Council using the details on their website www.cornwall.gov.uk, or to the police.

Graffiti or flyposting cannot be removed from private households and other private property without the owner's permission.

Flyposting

Flyposting is the unauthorised placing of advertising - usually posters or stickers.

Flyposters usually advertise or promote events and are placed without permission of the owner of the property and can take the form of stickers, signs or posters. Cornwall Council takes flyposting seriously - when you report flyposting, the Council will make enquiries into the source of the advertisements and take action if possible.

If you wish to report an incident of flyposting, please contact Environmental Management at Cornwall Council.

Graffiti

Graffiti are words or drawings, that are written, painted, sprayed or scratched on the surface of any property.

Cornwall Council are responsible for removing graffiti from public buildings, street furniture or monuments as well as removing flyposted material.

Other items such as telephone boxes, bus shelters and electricity boxes are the responsibility of the company that owns then.

However, Cornwall Council have a power to issue a 'defacement removal notice' to the property owner, which requires them to remove the graffiti or flyposting within 28 days. If they fail to do so, Cornwall Council can do the work ourselves and recover the costs.

The photographs, memorabilia and their individual stories gave a moving and vivid reminder of how much we owe that generation for the lives we enjoy today.

In November George Kestle gave an entertaining talk covering winter interest in the garden – colour slides illustrated the wife variety of plans and combinations to provide visual impact from October to May. George is a passionate plans man with a real sense of fun; he works tirelessly mainly for the benefit of others, and is always a valued speaker to the many garden clubs he visits.
