ELECTIONS

The first week in May saw Town, Parish and County elections. The Parish Council was uncontested and therefore an election was not required. Former councillors Roger Wickett, Robert Flower, Mary Dyer, Thelma Dorman, Nicholas Spurdens, John Brooks, David Hodge and Max Roberts are joined by Michael Goward. Their first meeting being the Annual Meeting, was held on Monday 13th May and Cllr. Wickett was elected as Chairman with Cllr. Hodge being elected as Vice-Chairman.

Two vacancies still exist on the Parish Council and these will be filled by Co-option. The Notices are displayed on the parish noticeboards now If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, applications in writing should be submitted to the Clerk by noon on Wednesday 29th May.

The Annual Public Parish Meeting will take place on Wednesday 5th June at 7.00 p.m. at Tintagel Social Hall. Parishioners may air their views or ask questions on any parish matter. The Agenda for this meeting is already displayed on the Parish noticeboards.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES

The conveniences at the Visitor Centre are now the sole responsibility of the Parish Council. Thanks must be expressed to Claire and Larry of Lunar Orbis for their kind offer of cleaning and locking the public conveniences. The Parish Council have also resolved to purchase the conveniences at Bossiney from Cornwall Council. Although the conveniences are currently closed, a programme of refurbishment works has been agreed with Cornwall Council and it is hoped that either way the conveniences will be re-opened before the Whitsun period. It may mean a short closure again in the near future in order for the refurbishment to be carried out.



The Clitheroe Kid

From 1957 to 1972 a diminutive Northern comedian called Jimmy Clitheroe, was the star of the radio programme and there were 290 episodes until it finished in 1972. Jimmy was aged 35 when he started the show but he could have passed as an 11 year old, as he had



never grown physically beyond that age. He was only four-foot-three in height. A quarter of the population would listen in but by 1972 the large weekly audience of around ten and a half million, had dropped to just one million.

The programme was recorded with a studio audience and there were gales of laughter at the antics of Jimmy. He always dressed as schoolboy for the show, with a blazer and a cap to complete the illusion. Real children never appeared so Jimmy really did come across as a schoolboy with his childish humour. The one person who escaped Jimmy's quick wit on the radio was his mother. In real life his father had died and he lived with his widowed mother, and was devoted to her. Jimmy would not stand for his mother being mocked, even if it were only his fictional mother on the radio.

Among the cast were Tommy Riley (Mouth Organ), Patricia Burke (Mother), Peter Sinclair (Grandfather), Leonard Williams (Theodore Craythorpe and Harry Whittle), Danny Ross (Alfie Hall), Diana Day (Jim's sister, Susan). Many famous stars of the day were guests of the programme. Bob Monkhouse, Morecombe & Wise, Harry Worth, Terry Hall, Tessie 'O Shea, Robb Wilton and on and on.. When The Clitheroe Kid ended in 1972, the world fell apart for Jimmy Clitheroe. His female companion Sally, had recently died in a car crash and in the following year his mother also died, Within 12 months the main stays of his life had both died and on the day of his mother's funeral in June 1973, Jimmy Clitheroe was found dead at his home, he was just 51.

The Clitheroe Kid was a weekly must for devoted listeners and is a programme that can never be forgotten. Fond Memories of a gentler

Our speaker, Elizabeth Reeves, gave a beautifully illustrated talk describing the work of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC).

The founder, Sir Fabian Ware a journalist, became commander of the British Red Cross at the start of WW1, being too old to enlist at 45.

Horrified by the appauling conditions and horrendous loss of

life he had witnessed, he and his unit, recorded and cared for all the known, to ensure they were never forgotten.

After the end of the war there was a massive undertaking by CWGC to landscape and plant the cemeteries, over seen by the likes of Sir Edwin Lutyens and Gertrude Jekell. Care was taken to use species appropriate to the particular country-for England a red rose named Remembrance was often used.

These gardens serve as a focus for the families of the fallen, and a constant reminder that today we are able to live in comparative comfort and freedom due to the ultimate sacrifice of all those brave young men and women.

Elizabeth is one of our most valued speakers, gave us a unique account of these gardens and how they can play a powerful role in our lives today.

Tintagel Sea Angling Club Newsletter – June 2013

March and April were very difficult months with prolonged cold easterly winds keeping the sea temperature down and the fishing very slow. This was very noticeable by the number of returns recorded by the CFSA, only seven fish were recorded from the whole of Cornwall during March the worse for several years. However, with sea temperatures now creeping up the summer species have started their return. The mackerel shoals have migrated shoreward and the bream and mullet have also started to run up the estuaries.

Congratulations go to Garry Boyde who won the collaboration match in April with a dab of 100%. Garry also came third in the St Columb Open with a Rockling over 100% winning him a ABU Atlantic beachcaster.

The Cornish Federation of Sea Anglers (CFSA) has launched a campaign to prohibit all enmeshing, entanglement and surround netting inside the ten metre depth contour of our coastal waters. An Information pack has been sent out to a number of tackle shops throughout Cornwall together with a petition to support this proposal. It is hoped that as many anglers as possible and other interested parties such as bird watchers, divers, conservationist and surfers will sign the petition and that the Cornwall Inshore Fisheries Conservation Authority will implement a byelaw to prohibit the use of nets in support of the campaign. The IFCA recently replaced the Sea Fisheries Committees (SFC) in England and there role is to manage a sustainable marine environment and inshore fishery. The new organisation is being monitored with great interest by recreation angling organisations such as the Bass Anglers Sportfishing Society (BASS) and National Mullet Club (NMC). The specific interest to the recreational organisations is the Minimum landing Sizes (MLS's) for commercial vessels these have been adopted from the old SFC but it is hoped that they will be increased for certain species such as bass, mullet and dab. Currently the MLS for bass is 37.5cm and female bass do not mature until they reach at least 42cms. The grey mullet MLS is 20cm but the female does not reach maturity until 47cms. Common sense would indicate that the IFCA would look at reviewing the old MLS's and furthermore involve recreation representatives in there discussions.

In the last newsletter I wrote about Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstal who had turned his attention to Marine Conservation Zones (MCZ's) with his "Save our Seas" campaign and his efforts to get you to write to your MP's to get them to consider adopting the recommendations of all 127 proposals not just the 31 chosen by the government. The consultation period has now ended and if you are one of the 24,000+ that sent an email you should expect a reply by July.

Forthcoming events during June and July include a club collaboration match with CADSAC on Sunday 9^{th} June and the Grenville open to be held on the weekend of the $29^{th}/30^{th}$ June. The Cornish Lure Festival hosted by Ben at the Art of Angling is to be held on $5^{th}/6^{th}/7^{th}$ July which coincides with the first Padstow Open held on the $6^{th}/7^{th}$ We have another club collaboration match over the weekend of the 12th-14th July with the last weigh in at 10.30pm. The target species for fish of the month in June is bass and in July, it is mullet.

The big tides in June are on the 24^{th} & 25^{th} with the full moon on the 23^{rd} and the new moon on the 8^{th} where sunrise will be at 5.10 & sunset at 21.29 In July the big tides are on the 24^{th} & 25^{th} and the full moon is on the 22^{nd} the new moon is on the 8^{th} when sunrise will be at 5.17 & sunset at 21.33

The next general meeting will be held on Tuesday 4th June at the Wootons Hotel at 7.30pm.


'OPEN THE BOOK' COMES TO TINTAGEL PRIMARY SCHOOL

TINTAGEL MEMORIAL PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 1st MAY, 2013 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In the last year we have seen a period of planning for the future and have gained detailed planning permission for an extension to the Pavilion to provide improved changing and shower facilities for all sports played at the Playing Fields. We are currently engaged in finding the funding for that project and its long term running costs. One of the possible areas which is being researched to assist with funding long term running costs is using green technology for the heating of the water for showers etc.

The Children's Play Area is in very good order and is in almost constant use. The rest of the grounds are in prime condition in spite of the curious weather pattern recently thanks to the groundsmen who give so much of their time free of charge. I think it appropriate again that we include in the minutes of this meeting a record of our gratitude to them for their ongoing efforts and support without which we would be unable to maintain the quality of the playing and recreation areas.

We have hosted Camelford RFC for the fourth season running and we are very grateful indeed for their contribution of assistance to the maintenance of the grounds. As evidenced by the Treasurer's report, we have managed to maintain a reasonable balance in the financial account over the past year.

Our success is that we have a huge number of people using the facilities. However, as I stated in last year's report there is always a cost to success. Yet again the cost is that litter is being left around the areas of the football pitches and the skate park, in spite of the provision of litter bins. This is both unsightly and a safety hazard and must be controlled. The Trustees reiterate that they insist that the clubs using those areas must take responsibility for controlling the litter and cleaning the area after use or else accept that the cost of litter removal must devolve to them. It cannot be left to the TMPFA to bear the cost unless there is a significant increase in the club leases to cover the cost of the removal of the litter.

Finally, organisations such as the Tintagel Memorial Playing Fields Association rely almost entirely on voluntary help to survive. I consider that the success of the TMPFA is due, in the most part, to the efforts of those particular Trustees who give most of their free time either directly or indirectly year after year for the good of the Association. I would again like to thank in particular the three most prominent Trustees: Steve Brown, Guy Keenan and David Littlejohns and also the voluntary Cricket Club groundsmen, Kevin O'Kelly and Dave Lane, for their selfless and continued efforts in keeping the Tintagel Memorial Playing Fields in such good condition.
