SEAGULL PROOF SACKS

Cornwall Council has recently trialled seagull proof sacks in a number of areas. These sacks are for the containment of domestic household refuse which is not put out in bins. Household refuse should be bagged as usual and the seagull proof sack can hold up to the equivalent of 3 black bags of rubbish. Loose rubbish will not be collected. The sacks can help you protect your rubbish from seagulls and other vermin and will help reduce the



amount of litter on your street. It is easy to store between collections and has proved to be very effective in seaside areas. Further information can be found at <u>www.cornwall.gov.uk</u>

This afternoon Carol and I did a shift in the Visitor Centre and there certainly seems to be more people coming to the village. The centre is proving a great success and much thanks must be given to the councillors, volunteers and Clerk who all give willingly so much of their time.

On Tuesday afternoon I went to a presentation in the Ladies Masonic Hall by Westward Housing, with the proposed plans for the site at School Hill. This was organised at very short notice by Westward Housing and although the parish got the advertising notices out straight away I expect many of you will have missed it. This is a proposal for a large development of houses and flats on the edge of our village. The plans are due to be presented to Cornwall Council at any time now, and of course will come to the Parish. If you have any opinions the parish council is always pleased to hear them and will give time at the start of each meeting for you to speak to us. Watch the parish notice boards for dates and times of forthcoming meetings.

The Bossiney toilets will soon be open again and will be run alongside the toilets at the Visitor Centre by the Parish. They will be cleaned by volunteers and it is hoped we can keep costs to a minimum. Unfortunately, this is one of the many services the County Council no longer funds.

These problems are all part of the everyday life of a Parish Councillor. The Council at this time is running with two councillors shore and we are looking to fill these positions in the Autumn, so if anyone feels they have time and commitment to the Parish, please watch the notice boards.

TINTAGEL VISITOR CENTRE -CELEBRATING END OF YEAR 1 SUCCESS



On Thursday 20th June 2013 a very happy band of volunteers dropped into Tintagel Visitor Centre to celebrate an extremely successful first year in business.

Back in September 2011 Cornwall Council closed the Visitor Centre because under their management, in spite of logging some 90,000 visitors per year, it was making substantial annual losses. To keep it open Cornwall Council would have needed to increase local council taxes.

The terms and conditions of a possible discounted sale to The National Trust were not acceptable to Tintagel Parish Council. The public toilets would have been closed and after only 3-years the site could have been sold for development. The Parish Council considered the Visitor Centre to be a key village asset, welcoming tourists from many different countries and offering a valuable local information service. They did not want to see the centre toilets closed, they did not want to see a new profit driven business making life even harder for existing local shops and they did not want to see the site sold for development. So, after much local consultation and successful negotiations to achieve a deeply discounted purchase price, the Parish Council voted in favour of buying the Visitor Centre and running it as a community business project. It re-opened on Monday 18th June 2012.



One year on, a happy band of volunteers including Parish Councillors and local residents, continue to give their time, energy and enthusiasm to run the Centre. Their rewards are plenty of smiles and accolades from grateful visitors and the warm feeling of being part of a very friendly and successful team. All should feel very proud because due to their combined efforts the Visitor Centre has made enough money in the first year to cover all costs.

The centre has been completely re-stocked with good quality products that appeal to all ages. New initiatives such as in-house designed walks leaflets and

the first visitor magazine to be produced by Tintagel for over 40 years have generated substantial income. The challenge is to do even better next year.

The brave decision taken by Tintagel Parish Council to purchase the Visitor Centre has been proven to be a good decision. Many other information centres are now under threat of closure. 

A morning in the life of Tintagel Visitor Centre

Myself and two other local volunteers arrived for the morning shift – 10.00 a.m. – 12.30 p.m. A beautiful Cornish day, blue sky, light breeze. Nick, another volunteer, opened up, checking as he goes, sorting the till etc. Michael proceeded to hoover, his wife Jo polishing the display tops – myself checking shop displays and level of stock required for replacement.

We all finished our chores standing behind the counter discussing our programme to come for that morning. We then spotted two, the very latest in coach travel 2013, enormous coaches, bright orange, pulling into our car park. Each coach I think can carry up to 48 persons and without warning a tsunami of people flowed through our open door.

This wave of people filled our Visitor Centre. I could only see heads and hear the many languages spoken. Suddenly around the counter we were three deep in people, impossible to move.

I said quietly to Jo if she stayed behind the till, forgetting everything else – simply take the money – I would stand on the left side, checking the items offered, prices, preparing bags and wrapping paper – also answering as many questions as I could.

Michael stood the other side of Jo giving support when needed, supplying the numerous requests for stamps and answering as many questions as he could. Nick in the background rushing for the extra stamps needed to keep the purchasing line flowing.

I planted my feet firmly on the ground and into the tourist baptismal storm I went. For what appear to be a very long time we were an efficient information and selling team, Jo worked the till superbly, Michael completely professional.

People seemed determined to spend, at the rate of knots, I had £20 and £50 notes waved in my face – and the questions – I hope I answered correctly – example:-how do you speak Tin-te-gal Tintagel? What is this 90p you ask? Can we eat vegetable food in your village? We are from France. We are from Italy. We are from Germany. Can you speak some German? This is our first time in your Cornwall, it is beautiful. I welcomed each one to Cornwall and please come again.

After the last visitor had clambered back into their coach and left, we sank into our seats, a stiff black coffee was the order of the day – adrenaline still riding high. We discussed the events and felt very proud of ourselves and our Visitor Centre which we think is the best in Cornwall.

There had been times when I found myself muttering Don't Panic just like Sergeant Jones of Dads Army!

Tintagel Sea Angling Club Newsletter – July 2013

May and June continued to be very difficult months with prolonged periods where the bait fish moved offshore. Sea temperatures remained lower than normal during May and June but are now creeping up and have reached 17^{0} C at the time of writing.

Nigel Rundle won the collaboration match held throughout the month of May with a Gilthead bream of 4lb 12ozs, the fish was also a new club record and winner of fish of the month. Nigel was also among the prizes during the Padstow open with a LSD of 2lb 6 7/8 ozs. Nick Topps won Junes fish of the month with a fine bass of 7lb and Derek Nute came second in the collaboration match held on the 9th June with a gilthead bream of 3lb 1 ³/₄ ozs.

The Cornish Federation of Sea Anglers (CFSA) has launched a campaign to prohibit all enmeshing, entanglement and surround netting inside the ten metre depth contour of our coastal waters. An Information pack has been sent out to a number of tackle shops throughout Cornwall together with a petition to support this proposal. It is hoped that as many anglers as possible and other interested parties such as bird watchers, divers, conservationist and surfers will sign the petition and that the Cornwall Inshore Fisheries Conservation Authority will implement a byelaw to prohibit the use of nets in support of the campaign. If you wish to support the campaign there is a local petition available at Camping Sport and Leisure, Fore Street, Tintagel.

The Bass Anglers Sportfishing Society (BASS) in conjunction with the Angling Trust has been campaigning long and hard to introduce changes to current capture methods to reduce the pressure on bass stocks. Now after a scientific report showed a serious decline of 32% over two years and very weak young bass survival since 2008 the EU has finally set up a commission to discuss emergency measures. The Angling Trust is organising and running an all discipline points league, anglers can compete at national level with other competitors in a "virtual fishing league" and will be able to compare results with team mates and other club competitors around the country. The National Fishing League runs from 3rd August 2013 to 30th March 2014 but registration is open now. The Angling Trust National Fishing League is free to enter for all individual anglers. Just go to <u>www.anglingtrust.net/nfl</u> and follow the prompts to register and obtain your Unique Participation Number.

The consultation period on Marine Conservation Zones (MCZ's) has now ended and we await the government's response.

Forthcoming events during August and September include a club collaboration match with CADSAC on Sunday11th August with the last weigh in at 10pm. The Tintagel open shore competition is to be held on the weekend of the 21^{st} / 22^{nd} September.

First prize is £200, 2nd is £100 and 3rd is £50. There are also several other specimen prizes. Entry fee is only £5 and the competition is open to

everyone. The target species for fish of the month in August is wrasse and in September, it is pollack.

The big tides in August are on the 22^{nd} & 23^{rd} with the full moon on the 21^{st} and the new moon on the 6^{th} where sunrise will be at 6.00 & sunset at 20.39

In September the big tides are on the 20^{th} & 21^{st} and the full moon is on the 19^{th} the new moon is on the 5^{th} when sunrise will be at 6.44 & sunset at 19.52

The next general meeting will be held on Tuesday 6th August at the Wootons Hotel at 7.30pm.

Do You Remember... Sing Something Simple

Warm, smooth, cosy and Sunday-Evening sentimental. а institution on Radio 2, founded by and ran by Cliff Adams, until he died in 2001. Cliff had formed the Stargazers with Dick James in 1950, and joined the BBC Show Band in 1954. On 3rd of July 1959, the singers first appeared on the BBC Light Programme in Sing Something Simple, also featuring Emblow and Jack on piano



accordion. His troupe of singers consisted of twelve men and four women. The format, style and purpose of the show remained unchanged throughout its broadcast lifetime. The programme made people hum along and that is why most of the group was men,

Whilst Sing Something Simple was to play an important role for much of the rest of Adams's life - there were short-lived TV spin-offs, 1961's Something Old, Something New and 1964's Sing-Along Saturday - it was by no means his exclusive musical activity. In 1964 Duke Ellington chose Adams's group to sing with his orchestra at Coventry Cathedral, and when Ellington returned a few years later, the partnership was renewed. In 1976 Adams ventured into the world of West End theatre musicals with the score for the two-act show Liza of Lambeth at the Shaftesbury Theatre, based on the novel by W. Somerset Maugham.^[1]

For much of his life, Adams lived in Chelsea, where he built up an art collection of British pictures from the first part of the 20th century. Cliff had open-heart surgery in the late 1970s and after he recovered he took up tennis, playing almost every day at the Queen's Club.

Adams, who died aged 78 in 2001, was married three times, and is survived by two daughters and a son.




