PUBLIC CONVENIENCE CLEANING

The Parish Council is currently giving consideration to the future cleaning and maintenance of the public conveniences at the Visitor Centre and possibly also those at Bossiney. If you may be interested in either/or of these positions, i.e. cleaning and/or maintenance, please contact Sue Moth, Parish Clerk (details on back of newsletter).

The future of public conveniences throughout Cornwall is still under review by Cornwall Council, although it is hoped that information about which conveniences they propose to keep open and which they propose to close will be available in the near future.

TREVENA SQUARE –

PLEASE DO NOT USE THE IMPROVED AND WIDENED ENTRANCE FOR PARKING

It has been noted that since the entrance was widened, primarily for safety purposes, some residents and delivery vehicles are still using the entrance to park their vehicles. Please **DO NOT** park your vehicles in the entrance driveway as this causes an obstruction and safety hazard for residents who use the car park in the way it was intended.

DOG FOULING

The Parish Council continues to receive complaints about dog fouling in the parish. Recent complaints have been received concerning the amount of dog fouling in Fosters Lane as well as in Trevena Square and the nature area.



YOU KNOW WHO YOU ARE !

Dog owners are reminded that should they be caught not cleaning up after their Dogs Cornwall Council will issue Fixed penalty notices to offenders currently set at £80.00 or prosecute at Magistrates Court where the penalty is up to £1000.00 maximum. In view of this Dog owners are urged to be responsible and clean up after your Dogs. Persons who clean up and throw the bags into hedges are liable for littering fixed penalties as they are committing an additional offence.

The number of people able to issue a fixed penalty notice on behalf of Cornwall Council is much higher. We are also currently training staff from other departments to issue notices – many of which do not wear uniform or have a marked vehicle – as such there are significantly more people who are able to catch offenders and therefore the chance of being caught much greater.



Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstal has now turned his attention to Marine Conservation Zones (MCZ's) with his "Save our Seas" campaign. Fearnley-Whittingstall recently said: "We're all here today because we

believe in the sea. We know it has an incredible power to enhance our lives. There's a public consultation going on right now over the proposals of 127 new marine reserves around the UK. So far we're a little concerned that the government are only going to look at 31 of those in the coming year, and at this point they haven't given us a time frame for the rest. What's particularly worrying is there are 33 areas that scientists have assessed as being in urgent need of protection and recovery that have not been included in the areas to be considered."

Dick Barton-Special Agent

At 6.45 pm each week night from 1946 to 1951 on the BBC Light programme, those magical words meant youngsters from all over the country, were listening to a radio set. The wonderful stirring signature tune 'Devils Galop' by Charles Williams set the mood for the show. It was the BBC's first serial and at its peak it was listened to by over 15 million people each night.



To begin with it starred Noel Johnson as Dick and later Duncan Carse followed by Gordon Davies took over the part. Throughout the whole series Jock was played by Alex McCrindle and Snowey White by John Mann. I can remember as a small boy rushing in from whatever I was doing to get my daily dose of Dick Barton. When the programme finished in 1951, I, along with many other youngsters, could never forgive the BBC replacing it, first with 'The Daring Dexter's' & then 'The Archers' which of course has run for nearly 50 years!!.

Dick Barton ran at a cracking pace with constant excitement and those lucky enough to have been listeners, will never forget the endings to each episode. Endings like "Has the plane crashed?...Can Barton survive? Don't miss the next episode of Dick Barton-Special Agent!" this was followed by the thunderous excitement of the celebrated signature tune.


Just writing these notes takes me back to those halcyon days of radio & wonderful memories of a great radio programme.

TINTAGEL GARDEN CLUB

Diana Lee, a medical herbalist, opened our winter programme in February with a beautifully illustrated talk on medical weeds. Many common weeds, hedgerow plants and herbs contain natural ingredients which have been used by man throughout time, to cure a variety of ailments. Salicylic acid found in willow bark or meadow mint is the active ingredient that is used in aspirin today. Diana described a range of common weeds, including dandelion, horsetail and nettle, to name but a few, that have beneficial properties- all of which must be treated with extreme caution and prescribed only by qualified herbalists. This unusual address certainly gave us food for thought promoting much interesting discussion with Diana during coffee and biscuits!



In March the naturalist Paul Rendell gave an illustrated talk entitled "The Secret Nature of the Tamar Valley". The Tamar Basically follows the Cornwall and Devon boundary- reaching the sea at Plymouth. Active mining ceased in the 1920's, with industries closing in the 50's, this now quiet area provides the ideal habitat for a wide range of flora and fauna.

Paul's impressive photography provided images of many creatures in their natural environment-we can now differentiate between the swallow, swift, and house martin! The bittern is no longer present in the Tamar, and others including lapwing, green finch, thrush are also on serious decline for a number of reasons, climate change where flooding can seriously effect ground nesting birds, and unseasonal cold spells reduce the availability of food. There is also an abundance of insects, including damsel and dragon flies, moths and butterflies such as the speckled wood, orange tip, gate keeper and a naughty image of the blue, to name but a few.

The animals include the hare (also in decline), red and fallow deer, and otter and of course the rabbit- introduced by the Romans to feed their armies!

The Valley is famed for its flora, which includes orchid, wild strawberry, and luminous moss, with carpets of snowdrops, daffodils and bluebells providing a magnificent spectacle under a canopy of indigenous trees; some bulbs can remain productive for 200 years.

Paul described the characteristics of many of these creatures, which certainly broadened our horizons, giving us so much to look out for on our next visit to this fascinating area.

DAN ROGERSON, MP, writes ...

As I write this, the Coalition Government have just announced the 2013 Budget, and there are lots of things to be welcome by people across North Cornwall.

The Chancellor had good news on something which I have been campaigning for over the past few weeks and months – the raising of the personal tax allowance to £10,000 next year. This means that people on low and average incomes won't pay any income tax on the first £10,000 earned. That's an extra £700 in everyone's pockets to help with the rising cost of living. This also brings the lowest earners out of paying income tax altogether, and helps to make sure that work always pays. This was the Liberal Democrats top priority at the last General Election and I am glad that we are delivering it in Government.



As well as reducing the tax bill for lower earners, the Coalition has also announced measures to curb tax avoidance. Tax on petrol and diesel has been frozen, meaning a planned 3 pence per litre rise in September won't happen now. I know that the price of fuel is one of the biggest issues facing people and businesses in our area, and so I'm glad that the Coalition has now frozen tax on fuel for 3 ½ years.

There is also a new Help-to-Buy scheme to help people get on the property ladder with interest-free loans for a deposit. Hard working families will also benefit from extra help with childcare costs, and above-inflation rises in tax on beer have been cancelled, which should help local pubs & breweries.

Small businesses, which are the backbone of North Cornwall's economy, also get help as the Government is cutting their National Insurance contributions, meaning it will be easier for them to hire new staff. In these tough economic times I hope that this will increase jobs and give relief to Cornish businesses.

As a Liberal Democrat I am delighted that in government, despite the difficult economic decisions the Coalition is having to take, we have managed to deliver a fair deal by lowering the amount of tax paid by people on low and average incomes, freezing fuel prices, making it easier for first time buyers, boosting job creation, helping local businesses and clamping down on tax avoidance.

Prior to the budget announcements all the talk centred around the Leveson Inquiry and proposals to make sure that we have a free and fair press, but also one that can't trash people's lives or reputations. Liberal Democrats and Labour had made it clear that David Cameron's proposals didn't go far enough in protecting people from the kind of abuse suffered by the parents of Madeleine McCann or Millie Dowler. I am pleased that David

Cameron has now come back to the negotiating table, and that Lord Leveson's key recommendations look set to be met through a robust Royal Charter.

In Parliament I have been continuing my campaign to make sure that Cornwall Council gets the amount of money it needs and deserves to deliver services for local people over the coming years. With the Cornwall Council elections in May, there are some important decisions coming up about who will represent you at County Hall, as well as the chance to have your say on how the Conservative & Independent Coalition in Truro have performed in the past few years. Whoever is in charge of Cornwall Council, they deserve a fair share of funding for public services. While poverty and disadvantage may not be as concentrated outside the cities, they still exist. We often have lower wages, higher house prices, higher transport costs, fewer facilities and spend more when accessing services. I will be keeping up the fight for a fair deal for Cornwall.



I begin by saying how delighted I am that the Camelford Leisure Centre is at long last open for our community to use and enjoy. After nearly two years of negotiations and endless meetings it is a great relief as well as delight to think the leisure centre has been saved for our local people to use. It now remains for the community to make full use of all the facilities that are and will be available there to use.

You probably have read or heard of the Cornwall Council budget plans for the next twelve months commencing April 1st. It has again been a very drawn out issue as to operate on reduced funding, and this budget will not be without some pain, but certainly relief for householders in that for the third year running there is no increase in Council Tax, although I rather sense that the Cabinet are being somewhat spiteful in their alternative plans after their initial plans were rejected.

I hope that the intention of some car parks having reduced charges will take effect, also some extra money going into youth services in the hope of further reducing anti-social behaviour.

I expect what will delight many of you is the intention to try to squeeze extra money for highways to mend potholes etc, and hopefully we will get a slice of a government grant for the western counties to repair some of the winter's damage to our roads.

Now I touch on two local issues, namely you may have noticed some hedge cutting has been carried out at Bowthick Hill, but I am still chasing for the remainder of the hedges to be cut so that vehicles are not scratched as they use this stretch of road.

Finally after many complaints to highways regards the road flooding on the Tregatta to Palmers Terrace stretch because of drainage of water getting away, I understand that a nominated scheme is coming into place for post April 2113.
